"Donate the Plate" 5th Sunday Program

An important part of HCCC is the Kids' Advocacy Place which provides district attorneys, law enforcement and child protective agencies in a child-friendly place in which to record the outcry reports of abused children.

- 9 Speaker Rev. Art Severance. Severance, now retired, is a former minister of First Church San Antonio, most recently minister of East Shore Church in Kirkland, OH, and interim minister in Boulder, CO; Stockton, CA; and Amherst, NY. He has moved back to San Antonio to be near grandchildren and three daughters who live in San Antonio and Austin.
- 10 Speaker Steve Brooks. Brooks is a writer and performer whose creativity points in many directions. His songs have been recorded by more than a dozen folk and Americana artists, like Slaid Cleaves, Russell Crowe and Albert & Gage. His two most recent CDs, "I'll Take You Home" and "Chasing Grace," have been played on more than 100 folk and Americana stations coast-tocoast. In an earlier incarnation on radio, he was a humorist who wrote a song-a-week for Jim Hightower's nationally-syndicated talk show. When he's not onstage, you can find him in a pulpit, speaking on topics like "Songwriting As a Spiritual Path." Or in a library, introducing kids to classic American folk songs. Or flexing his wits as six-time World Pun Champion. If that's not enough, he's been an award-winning journalist for over 25 years. Kick off your shoes and poke around a bit. You'll find plenty to keep you entertained and inspired, and you'll find out why Stave Magazine calls Steve "simply the most clever man you'll hear with a guitar."
- 30 Speaker Michael Wurth. Talk: TBA. Wurth was raised as a UU who was first exposed to Buddhism in the UU Religious Education curriculum "The Church Across the Street" in the late 1970s. He has since embraced Buddhist principles as part of his growing spirituality and in his counseling work. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor with a Masters from the University of Texas, San Antonio (and has almost recovered from being a screenwriter and film producer, director, and editor.) He has worked with youth, mindfulness and meditation, addiction, the blind, and specializes in counseling for men who find it difficult to seek help. He has been selected to serve as the San Antonio Director of Clinical Outpatient Services for a Hill Country rehabilitation center.

UU Fellowship Member, Dr. H Richard Leuchtag, PhD awarded Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Awards

Marquis Who's Who, the world's premier publisher of biographical profiles, presented UU Fellowship member, H. Richard Leuchtag, Ph.D., with the Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award. Dr. Leuchtag celebrates many years' experience in his professional network, and has been noted for achievements, leadership qualities, and the credentials and successes he has accrued in his field. As in all Marquis Who's Who biographical volumes, individuals profiled are selected on the basis of current reference value. Factors such as position, noteworthy accomplishments, visibility, and prominence in a field are all taken into account during the selection process.

A retired biophysics researcher and biology educator, Leuchtag taught at Texas Southern University, beginning in 1982 as an assistant professor and concluding his career in 1997 as a professor. A former researcher at the University of Texas Medical Branch and instructor at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis, Leuchtag also served as an associate editor for "Physics Today" in New York City and as a research associate in the biophysics research laboratory at New York University (NYU).

In his work on the biophysical problem of ion conduction across excitable membranes, Leuchtag rejected approaches based on questionable assumptions. With James Swihart, he focused on classical electrodiffusion theory based on electrodynamics and the Nernst-Planck equation. He developed a family of ordinary differential equations for stationary multi-ion electrodiffusion systems and found approximate solutions for timevarying ion currents across membranes.
