

Adult Religious Education Program to feature "Bill Moyers on Faith & Reason"

Beginning on Monday, March 12 from 1 - 3pm in the Wilma Palmer Annex, there will be a viewing of 1 or 2 videos from this series and thereafter, a discussion. Amazon describes this series in the following way:

"'Renowned intellectuals discuss the role of religion in modern society'

In a world where religion poisons some lives but gives profound purpose to others, how do we learn to live together? Join veteran journalist Bill Moyers (Joseph Campbell and the Power of Myth, Bill Moyers' Journal) as he sits down with 12 noted writers and thinkers from a wide spectrum of beliefs to discuss their search for meaning. These frank, one-on-one conversations touch on the pressing issues in our post-9/11 world: the increasing politicization of faith, the perceived gulf between science and religion, the tension between tolerance and free expression, and more. Original voices such as Margaret Atwood, Salman Rushdie, Martin Amis, Mary Gordon, and climatologist Sir John Houghton add a personal dimension as they talk openly about their most heartfelt beliefs and how those beliefs inform their lives and work."

"Our Church Life" - More Material on Sunday Services in Chronological Date Order...

- 4 Rev. Phil Mason. Sermon: "You are dust and to dust you shall return" - Answers to existential questions. Rev. Mason is a native of Austin, Texas and a 1996 graduate of The Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest. Ordained in the Diocese of Colorado, he served there as priest and rector for 13 years. In 2002 - 2003 he studied with the Interim Ministry Network of the Albin Institute and received certification of membership in the IMN. Upon retirement in 2009, he and wife Susan with whom he has been married for 28 years moved back to Texas and built a home near San Marcos. Since then he has served as Interim Rector at Grace Episcopal Church, Llano; St. Philip's Episcopal Church, San Antonio and St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Brady. He has spoken at San Marcos and New Braunfels UUF several times. Prior to serving as a minister he worked as a contract computer programmer and consultant. Susan and he have four children, six grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
- 25 Ann Galland, one of the church's founding members will lead the congregation in a "Flower Communion". She urges everyone to bring one flower to share with another member.

The title of her talk will be "Roots and Seeds" based on a sermon by UU minister, Rev. Gary Kowalski and the theme will be celebrating Spring and our connections to the Earth.

Rev. Kowalski is a UU minister, celebrated author of many books, and his interest lie in Eco-Spirituality, Science, History, and Animals. He graduated from Harvard Divinity School, and has served congregations in Vermont, Washington, Tennessee, Massachusetts, and New Mexico.

Frances was born in Austin, Texas and her parents are from Houston. She was raised Episcopalian and discovered Unitarian Universalism when she was searching for a liberal religious community in which to raise her son.

When she knew she was moving to Kerrville, she searched the internet to find a UU church as she is "a devoted, practicing UU and cannot imagine life without Unitarian Universalism".

Frances has interests in fellowship, hospitality, communications, website design, pastoral counseling and small group ministry. The church in turn provides her with friendship, spirituality and community.

The life path she most identifies with is as a UU Pagan. She writes and leads rituals for all kinds of occasions.

Gary was born in Fort Worth, Texas and brought up in Fort Worth and Arlington. His father was a banker and his mom, a homemaker and secretary. He's the eldest of two boys.

He was baptized as a baby in the Methodist faith and attended a Presbyterian church where he was baptized again as an adult. Thereafter, he was a Lutheran for about ten years. He became involved in the First UU Church of Austin after meeting his wife, Jill Wiggins. They married on May 31, 1996.

Gary and Jill found out about the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country when attending retreats at UbarU.

When asked why he became a member of the church, Gary simply responded, "the people". He is interested in church membership and doesn't rule out a future church leadership role.

He relishes "tasty potlucks, juicy sermons, food for thought, friendly people, great conversations and eclectic services". His interests are golf, current events/politics, movies and theater, both to attend and to perform. He has a one-man show about Clarence Darrow that he is interested in performing as a fundraiser for the church.

Jill was born in England and moved to the U.S. when she was 8 where she grew up in Norwalk, Ohio. She moved all over the States until landing to Austin in 1982. Kerrville became her home last June.

Her father was in the British RAF when she was born and her mother, a homemaker, knitter and wonderful cook. She reports that they were "both incredibly creative and smart despite relatively little education". Her older sister, Pat lives in Florida and a brother died in 2000.

Jill was christened in the Church of England on her first birthday and was confirmed in the Presbyterian Church. She lost her belief in Presbyterianism at age 18 and was unchurched until her late thirties, when she acted on a suspicion that she was a UU. She joined First UU Church of Austin in 1982.

After attending the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country beginning last summer she decided to become a member because she felt very welcomed, was impressed with the community and engagement of the membership. Her grand-daughter, Chloe who lives with her and Gary, enjoys the tiny RE program.

She loves the Joys & Concerns portion of the Sunday program as she feels she will be supported through good and bad times. This support is very important to Jill. She also likes sermons and services that provide spiritual and intellectual growth.

In addition to singing in the choir, Jill would like to flex her artistic self, as she has a degree in art. Her primary art currently is original art post cards, which she calls "Kindness cards". She gives them to people with a message asking the recipient to pass them along with a kindness.

She also loves knitting, walking/hiking, reading, movies and travel. She reports never being bored.
