11 Speaker - Lee Legault. Talk: "Out of Egypt, Into the Wilderness, and on to Freedom -Psychologist C.G Jung developed a paradigm for psychological growth called individuation and believed it to be humanity's most important work. From a Jungian perspective, Moses's life becomes a map to freedom through the arduous inner work of individuation. We'll reflect on what we gain when we leave the narrow straits of Egypt and lose our ego identities in the wilderness." Lee Legault is a Unitarian Universalist ministerial aspirant working on dual master's degrees in social work and divinity at the University of Texas and the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. She practiced law in the areas of civil litigation and appeals for fifteen years before answering her call to be a different kind of counselor.
