
Learning the Night Sky Wednesday, October 10 ★ 6pm Palmer Annex with "Star Party" thereafter

UUCHC ARE (Adult Religious Education) Committee would like to invite all to the first session of "Learning Our Night Sky" led by church member, Donnie Bunch. Dinner will be served while watching a "Great Courses" DVD titled "The Constellations and Their Stars", a 30 minute lecture given by Professor Edward M. Murphy of the University of Virginia.

Thereafter, and weather permitting, participants will car pool to the Schreiner University Loftis Observatory (which is just a mile from the church) for a **Star Party** which is open to the public. The Loftis Observatory is located in the 2000 block of East Main Street across from the Schreiner University baseball fields. There all will meet Dr. Kim Arvidsson of Schreiner University and will be able to utilize the university's large telescope. Donnie will also have his personal telescope there to assist with the observing.

Board members present were Linda Smith, Vicki Luther, Jerry Best, Jim McMahon and Meredith Hensley. Rev Ja was also in attendance.

Reports:

- Highlighted topics were the review of Bookkeeper's Report and financial status; the CCC report on all committee activities; the new Mission Statement to be sent out to the congregation; the Special Congregational Meeting of September 22 with focus on discussions and balloting for congregational decisions about the church future; Nominating Committee status; Annex as alcohol-tree space unless otherwise designated.
- CCC reported the following:
 - Financial Committee reported that the window fundraising is completed and donation plaques will be purchased.
 - Justice/Outreach reported that the Little Library has had some use.
 - Adult Religious Education reported that on October 10 Donnie Bunch will show a video and then those present will go to Shreiner University.
 - Membership reported that the sign for the front of the church will be installed soon.

Tarot Reading Classes ★ PA Saturdays in October ★ 10am-12pm

Beginning class on tarot reading will be led by church member, Frances Osborne on all Saturdays in October.



UBarU is the only Unitarian Universalist camp and retreat center in the central United States south of Minnesota and is just twenty miles west of Kerrville. UBarU has launched a capital campaign for 2018. The previous campaign for a single large project, the Rev. Dwight and Marie Brown Center in 2013 raised over \$600,000, thanks in significant part to the support of the members of First UU Austin. This beautiful facility has hosted nearly a thousand people since opening.

The campaign is structured into three tiers composed of several smaller projects that will be implemented in order of urgency, need and available funding. These three tiers address:

- critical infrastructure, including upgrading the septic system(\$60,000) and the water system(\$80,000);
- additional public meeting space (enclosing the end of the Brown Center - \$25,000-30,000) and adding a outdoor 100-150 seat amphitheater (\$75-100,000); and
- expanded private lodging (\$75,000 each). Since UBarU receives no outside support from the UUA or other institutional sources they depend almost totally on usage fees and donations for daily maintenance and operations.
