Board Meeting of Wednesday, 8/8/18 Condensed Minutes

Board members present were Vicki Luther, Jerry Best and Meredith Hensley. Rev Ja was also in attendance.

Reports:

- Highlighted topics were the review of Bookkeeper's Report and financial status; the CCC report on all committee activities with special emphasis on the front-of-church sign; the new windows to be installed as well as methods of fundraising and monies already donated; Special Congregational Meeting scheduled for 9/9* to focus on upcoming retirement of minister and congregational decisions about church future; UU Fellowship luncheon for the church on 8/26.
- Justice/Outreach reported urgent need for specific food items at Children's Advocacy; Candidate Beto O'Roarke this Sunday at Vet Center; UUCHC carpools.
- Sunday Service reported services planned through mid-September; plans in RE for program for older children starting September; need child care.
- Membership reported meeting for greeters, should have two greeters at each service.
- Activities Committee reported movie night 8/25 with chicken dinner provided; Circle Supper in annex planned for 9/1; Judy presented plans for UUCHC shirts with logo.
- The Minister's discussed her retirement and the transition and search process should the congregation decide to hire a new minister.
- The Board approved donation of \$1,000 to Kerr-Konnect originally scheduled for UU Musicians Conference for Meredith. She was unable to attend.


"Donate the Plate" 5th Sunday Program

Carolyn Dreyer
New member as of August 12, 2018

Carolyn was born in Massachusetts just two weeks before her father was deployed to the South Pacific during World War II. She stayed with her grandmother until his return. Her parents, Ruth and Charles Holbrook were from Winchendon and Boston, Massachusetts respectively.

Carolyn was raised Protestant and attended the nearest church to where her family lived. Since she lived in many different locations because her father would finish one of his engineering jobs and then move to the next, she attended Congregational, Baptist and Presbyterian churches in Alabama, Tennessee, New York, Massachusetts and more.

She is particularly proud of her two "fabulous" step-daughters/husbands in the Bay Area of California, along with a grandson (Anthony- 18, a freshman Purdue University) and two "gorgeous" granddaughters (Laura- 16, a ballerina who just returned from a month in Taiwan and who speaks Mandarin and is an oboist) and (Tracina- 14, who just returned from international Kung Fu tournament and is a guitarist/singer). Her third granddaughter, Rebecca died at 14 in 2016 of mitochondrial disease. This continues to sadden Carolyn.

She has one sister, Judi who is 4 years younger than her. Judi lives in Knoxville, TN with her husband Gene and 13 of Carolyn's nieces, nephews, grandnieces and nephews.

After graduating from Michigan State University in 1965 she began an extensive career in marketing, communications, public relations and advertising. Her first job was with Goodyear in their subsidiary "Motor Wheel" (auto wheels/brake drums) as their first female industrial editor. She won the Michigan Industrial Communication award in 1966.

A marriage brought her to California - San Diego and Los Angeles in particular. In 1969 Carolyn joined Phillips-Ramsey Ad Agency San Diego as Senior Copywriter. Accounts included SDG&E, ZOO/Wild Animal Park, Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, Mr Steak restaurants, General Dynamics and more.

After moving to Los Angeles (and commuting to San Diego) she began free-lance career with her own company, Carolyn Augustine Copy/Concepts. She was the Head Researcher/Script Writer for original cable TV show ANIMAL EXPRESS produced in San Diego.

Carolyn has been travelling since she was 12 and has visited 55 different countries and (almost) all 50 states. She notes that she is "supposed to be a travel writer but am too busy DOING it to write about it..."

In 1993 while in Virginia she became a member of a 700-member Unitarian church. When she moved back to San Diego in 1997 she attended UU churches but was not active.

Her friend, Tina Woods lured her to the Hill Country in April, 2016 and soon thereafter, Carolyn started attending the UU Fellowship and Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country. She did so mainly to seek out her "Tribe in this Conservative Wilderness".

Her reason for joining the church after being a friend for over two years was "the PEOPLE". She is impressed by "our tiny band of brothers and sisters who contribute SO much to this community and to each other!"

In addition to contributing fully financially to the church, she serves as the liaison to the Hill Country Crisis Council, is a member of the Justice/Outreach committee, cooks meals for Habitat for Humanity, works with the Raices group in the church to assist refugees and is a greeter.

What she would like to see from the church is more spiritual inspiration, more thought-provoking sermons, the "FREEDOM to discuss important issues, including political, OPENLY".

Note from the editor, Susan Lipp: I hope now that everyone has a glimmer of insight into Carolyn's life. In October, we will learn more about Aaron Thomas who became a member of the church on the same day.
