UUCHC and Freedom's Path Movie Night on Wednesday, June 21 Deemed a Success

The Outreach/Social Justice Committee's first Outreach event in conjunction with Freedom's Path VA apartments (on the grounds of the Kerrville VA Hospital) was deemed a success so plans are underway to continue this program.

Collaboration between VA social worker Kathy Turner and Reverend Ja Rickard led to planning with Freedom's Path management for this casual, fun evening. UUCHC Activities & Events Chair, Judy Ashcraft, worked alongside the on-site apartment manager to organize snacks, drinks and an appearance by John Wayne (in "Rio Bravo"). They deftly navigated a slight technical problem while nine residents and ten church members became acquainted.

The event was worth the delay to be able to watch some of the connections among the attendees. Linda and Chuck worried when their adopted Vet, Willie, arrived late. Thereafter, they were relieved to hear that a relative had taken him to dinner. Church members, having heard about Willie from Linda and Chuck, were eager to meet him.

The thrill and wonder in Vaughn's (Navy) face was evident as Rev. Ja shared her memorable story of meeting and providing water to Rev. King and his companions as they marched down the street on the way to Marquette Park in Chicago, Illinois in 1966.

Just five minutes later a thrown brick hit Rev. King in the head. This Chicago incident led King to tell reporters afterward, "I've been in many demonstrations all across the South, but I can say that I have never seen — even in Mississippi and Alabama — mobs as hostile and as hate-filled as I've seen here in Chicago."

Reverend Ja and Vaughn then shared memories and stories about that time period in our history. He was clearly honored and heartily shook her hand.

Rev. Ja also spent some quite time with a woman who shared the experiences that led to her PTSD diagnosis.

FROM YOUR MINISTER...

The finances of our congregation are a very important matter. By now all church contributors should have received a thank you letter for the pledges made to our congregation. This letter also included an update as to where you are in completing this year's pledge.

We (the Board and I) want to thank you for all you contribute both monetarily and through your service for the good of our congregation. At our last Congregational Meeting, Susan Lipp suggested that if our members knew where their pledges were going it might be helpful. The Board talked about this and I am bringing you this information. I agree that it is difficult to understand how much it takes to keep our doors open until you see the actual numbers. The basic bills to keep our buildings open for the last six months are:

In addition to these basic bills, minister and speaker fees were \$12,570.00 and Outreach and Activities were \$380.74; therefore, the total of the first six months of 2017 is \$21,424.63. This amount is very close to the figure that Andy provided at the January Congregational Meeting when he presented the budget for this year.

We have a few assets. This may seem like a lot of money to some but it is about enough to get us through a full year if we have no catastrophic events.

UUA elects New President

The Unitarian Universalist Association elected the Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray as its ninth president on June 24. Frederick-Gray is the first woman elected to lead the UUA, which includes approximately 1,000 congregations with 200,000 adults and children in the United States.

But as she spoke to the UUA's General Assembly after being named winner in the three-way race, Frederick-Gray said, "I want to be clear, right up front. I am not the first female president of the UUA." As UUs cheered, she turned to applaud and then embrace the Rev. Sofía Betancourt, one of the three co-presidents appointed by the Board of Trustees to complete the term of President Peter Morales, who resigned April 1. "But I am honored to follow her!"
