As Ellen Jackson, head of this church outreach endeavor has noted, refugees continue to enter the United States particularly from Central America numbering in the hundreds despite what is being reported. La Casa de Raices is also a focus for the Texas Unitarian Universalist Justice Ministry (TXUUJM).
