History

We all know the history of our congregation and hopefully, are all aware of the fact that we still have members who were a part of creating the congregation we call home today. Much hard work, long hours, and inviting people to become a part of our little congregation resulted in our being the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country. Hopefully we are working to keep that tradition alive by inviting new people to join us, helping to realize goals that the congregation would like to achieve and by becoming a part of the fabric that keeps us together.

This month I will be preaching on history. Not the history of our congregation, but the history of the Universalist Church in the state of Texas. The Universalists are only half of our denomination as we merged with the Unitarians back in 1961 and became the Unitarian Universalists Association. These two denominations were small and struggling and felt that to keep their traditions alive they would join forces. Together they did exactly what a small, struggling group of people should do; they rolled up their sleeves and went to work.

In 1961 we were a denomination of just over 141,000 members. Today we number over 800,000 friends and members. We have come a long way and are fortunate to belong to the Unitarian Universalist Association where we are a free faith belonging to a larger group of autonomous congregations.

Later this month I will talk about another part of our denomination's history, The Cambridge Platform. The Cambridge Platform is a document that was written in 1648 and defines the governance of free congregations. It is clear and succinct in defining how our congregations should be run. We all need direction and The Cambridge Platform gives us that direction.

When we want to know why we do what we do as a congregation we can always refer back to our history and let it guide us. Our congregation has a rich history and we need to continue to learn from our short-comings, mistakes and of course, triumphs.
