## Service to Others Strong Theme for Church in 2016 as well as 2017

The Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country amply serviced the community in 2016 and the plans for 2017 show little abatement. Led by Outreach/ Social Justice Committee Chair, Karen Burkett, below are some of the many accomplishments reached and programs planned.

### La Casa de Raices (Refugee And Immigrant Center for Education and legal Services)

Spearheaded by Ellen Jackson, the Church prepared a record breaking 39 backpacks to assist refugees as they as they left for final destinations somewhere in the United States in April, 2016. These refugees are primarily young mothers and their small children who are escaping violence in their Central American countries. The numbers of refugees have surged recently due to the perceived threat and uncertainty following the election of Donald Trump.

Then **Backpack/Undix Sunday** gathered muchneeded undergarments for between 300 and 800 families per month, followed by a Baby Shower in early November for the youngest refugees.

Church members and friends volunteered hundreds of hours to assist in Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners, organizing efforts, cleaning/housekeeping and plumbing and electrical expertise/services.

To cap off the year, a special Holiday Tree was assembled to focus on the purchasing of small stuffed animals or donating cash to the children of La Casa de Raices.

The Church recently received the following heartfelt note of thanks from Sister Mary Grace who helps to oversee La Casa.

Let me add my thanks for your support of the mothers and children who arrive in San Antonio with no one to look to for support except us. Your generosity in thinking of these families from clothing to time to toiletries and back pack snacks to money makes a huge difference in the new lives they are beginning here. I love you all so dearly!

### "Donate the Plate" 5th Sunday Program

This Church program was reestablished in July, 2016. On the fifth Sunday of every month with a fifth Sunday, all moneys in the collection plate not designated for the church are donated to a worthy non-profit organization.

In 2016, much-appreciated donations were raised for **PFLAG** (July) and **Hill Country Cares** (October).

Since there are five Sundays in January, CAM (Christian Assistance Ministry) has been selected to be the recipient of this important program on January 29.

#### **CAM Donation Program**

On the second and fourth Sundays of every month, this program focuses on gathering items to service the neediest in our community through CAM (Christian Assistance Ministry). On the second Sunday, the collection focuses on canned, boxed or bagged non-perishable food items and on the fourth Sunday, the collection is devoted to personal products; shampoos, soaps, facial tissues, etc.

These items are amassed in specially marked boxes at the back of the church and delivered to help fill the pantries at CAM.

In addition to this, Reverend Ja has donated her time during special distribution days.

In 2016, the donations of items totaled over 397 items equaling over 280 pounds and \$570 in value, thus exceeding the goal of 320 items valued at \$500!
