Welcoming Congregation

On Sunday, March 19, 2017 our congregation took a vote to determine if we were ready and willing to become a Welcoming Congregation and on May 30 the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country became one. If you look at our congregational listing on the UUA website, note a UU Chalice over a Pride/Rainbow flag. This designation tells anyone who is looking for a congregation that is welcoming to the LGBT community that we will gladly accept them and if they choose to remain with us, we will welcome them into our congregation with open arms.

There are many ways to become a Welcoming Congregation and our congregation took a somewhat different approach in educating our membership. Rather than hosting a lecture series, we invited the congregation to watch TED Talks and thereafter, discussed each. Curtis Overstreet and Ellen Jackson spent much time watching TED Talks and then picked the best of the best to use as our teaching tools. The conversations were filled with understanding and learning for both myself, as the facilitator and the members of the congregation.

"Our Church Life" - More Material on Sunday Services...

Speaker - Michael Wurth - Topic: "Why The Most Intolerant Always Wins - And How Unitarians Can Grow From That". In this talk, Counselor and Buddhist Wurth examines a special kind of intolerance - the tyranny of the most intolerant. From handicapped bathrooms to kosher water and automatic transmissions, we are faced with decisions about tolerance every day without thinking of it. But as Unitarians, we observe the Fifth Unitarian Principle; the right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large. And this goal seems like it might be in conflict with any notion of intolerance. And the growth of more and more radical approaches to fundamentalism and spiritual purity may suggest that the time for a democratic congregation may be limited. It isn't. In this talk, Buddhist Unitarian Wurth discusses how modern and social media may endanger the spiritual growth we are capable of together, but the test of our own tolerance can actually build our spiritual strength. Using examples from smoking sections in airplanes to the Duncan Hines company, Wurth will show how to use intolerance to make us more observant, democratic, and above all, more tolerant of ourselves as we walk the common path of our lives.


