"Our Church Life" - More Material on Sunday Services in Chronological Date Order...

7 Speaker: Rev. Art Severance - Topic: "Everything is Holy: Scientific Spirituality in Nature". Based on a book, When God is Gone Everything is Holy: The Making of a Religious Naturalist by Chet Raymo, a physics and astronomy professor.

Rev. Art Severance has been speaking to the church since the 1990s, when the church was meeting at Schreiner College. Now retired after almost 30 years in ministry he has moved back to San Antonio, where he served as minister at First UU Church from 1991-2006, helping it grow from 250 to over 400 and building a 500-seat sanctuary

Originally from New Hampshire, he has been married to wife Cathie since 1973, has 3 married daughters and 5 grandchildren. He has served UU Congregations in PA, NJ, CA, CO, TX, NY, and OH either as interim, part or full-time or Developmental minister, served on the old District Board, was one of the district's Ministerial Settlement Representatives, and currently serves on the board of UURMAPA (UU Retired Ministers & Partners Association).

Severance is a folksinger & songwriter and has a CD available titled "Listen to the Whirlwind", as well as 2 small books, Sermons, Songs & Scribblings; Searching for Truth, Love, Meaning, and Perhaps Even God and Sermons & Scribblings: Book the Second which will be available after the service. He enjoys photography, antiques, HGTV, World Religions, Psychology, reading mysteries, New England, and music. He considers himself a "Mystical Humanist with a good sense of humor."

14 Speaker: Pam Haylock - Topic: "Stopping Human Trafficking: Efforts at the Local Level". Several non-profit organizations and public offices have joined together to educate providers and the public about trafficking. Do you know what to do if you see something that looks suspicious? Pam will offer a view of the problem, what to do and how you can help.

Haylock is as an oncology nurse with a specialty in cancer survivorship and holds a PhD from UT Galveston. She currently serves as president of the local branch of the American Association of University Women and has been part of a multi-organization effort to educate the public about human trafficking in our area.

21 Speaker: Rev. Peter Bauer - Topic: "How Do You Find Home? - A look at poverty and profit in U.S. housing".

Bauer is a United Church of Christ minister but that is only the beginning. He is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist. Bauer currently works in the Frank Tejada Outpatient Clinic at the South Texas Veterans Health Care System in San Antonio. He is a Medical Service Corps officer in the US Army Reserve holding the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

For several years Bauer served as this church's part-time Pastor until he was mobilized for active duty with the US Army. He served for 4.5 years and then returned to the San Antonio area. Peter is back with us and anxious to renew old friendships as well as make new ones.

28 Speaker: Mikie Baker - Topic: The Power of Information - A talk on the importance of the truth and always having access to it.

There is power in powerful, honest communication. (Baker will also review the history of our Hill Country Radio Station, KTXI, and what the future holds for all of Texas Public Radio.)

Baker began her career in the radio industry as the Music Director for KLIF in Dallas where she received gold records for her achievements in radio programming. Thereafter, she joined T.G.I. Friday's, Inc. creating the company's first creative arts department.

In 1990, Baker started her own marketing and design firm, The Baker Agency, which specialized in the hospitality industry and worked with restaurants, hotels and beverage companies throughout the country.

Baker retired to the Hill Country to care for her aging mother and then began a writing career which included a weekly humorous column for the <u>Bandera County Courier</u>. She was twice voted Top Ten Columnist in the State.

After her mother passed away, Baker went back to work for Texas Public Radio, as the Community Liaison for the outlying stations. Baker's duties include outreach, marketing, underwriting and events. She started the Medina Garden Patch, a children's learning garden at Medina ISD, is on the board of Bandera County's Silver Sage and is an avid vegetable gardener.

# Summary of Wednesday, June 12, 2019 Board Meeting

**Present:** Board President Jerry Best; Vice President Vicki Luther; Treasurer Judy Bunch; Secretary Jill Wiggins; Member-at-Large Meredith Hensley; and Activities & Events Chair Judy Ashcraft.

Board meeting minutes from the May 8, 2019 meeting were approved. Bunch presented the financial report which was also approved. The decision as to switching bookkeeping duties to Bunch's firm was tabled pending her asking the current company if it will provide QuickBook backups. The new cost would be \$125-140 per month as compared to the current cost of \$150-180 per month.

Committee Chair Council report: Hensley reported that she would invite all chairs to attend CCC meetings, and that the meetings should be for action and planning, not just for reports.

Judy Ashcraft reported the following:

- Girls' night out and men's lunches are going well;
- the next potluck will be Father's Day;
- Game Night will be June 22;
- cookbooks are available for \$15; and
- there will be an open house at the Parsonage on July 20 with hot dogs and grilled veggies available and sides provided through the potluck. The Board, Activities Events, and CCC will provide setup and cleanup.

Membership reported that several people have expressed interest in attending an orientation class, which will be set sometime in July. Membership will also initiate a mentoring system for new members and will recruit longer-time members to serve as mentors. Membership will also develop a Care Team and ask for volunteers to serve.

Best reported that Justin Biemer has nearly finished the new web page and when it's ready it will be switched from GoDaddy to Wordpress.

Search Committee: Hensley reported that at their next meeting they will set up evaluation criteria, and the evaluation process will begin in August.

There was discussion of the church joining the Chamber of Commerce. Vicki will investigate.

After discussion of a church memorial for Andy Pesez, it was agreed to have a stained glass window made to hang in one of the sanctuary windows. Vicki will look into finding a designer.

Best presented a revised parsonage policy, and the policy was approved by a motion and vote.

A decision to appoint a finance chair was tabled.

The board discussed plans for the upcoming Congregational meeting set for Sunday, June 16.
