Transportation Planning Council Update

Karen Burkett, chair of the Outreach/Social Justice Committee has provided the following update for The Transportation Planning Council which the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Hill Country has been instrumental in creating.

The Council now has:

- ③ a formal name: KerrKonnect: "We give you a lift";
- a mission statement: "Connecting the Kerrville area community by providing safe and reliable transportation that will help maintain independence and enhance quality of life";
- some direction as to what the system will look like; and
- need for Board Members (see skill sets listed below).

By completing the National Volunteer Transportation Center Exercise (2014) "Plan a Volunteer Driver Program", specific characteristics under two major features of a transit system were created for Kerrville/Kerr County.

ORGANIZATION FEATURES:

- serve the general public including, but not limited to, seniors and people with non-wheelchair disabilities;
- 2. volunteer drivers, at least in the beginning;
- volunteers' cars, at least in the beginning, and perhaps owned/leased vehicles;
- 4. non-profit organization 501(c)(3);
- 5. service area within 10 mile radius from center of Kerrville;
- 6. initial sponsor: Dietert Community Center;
- 7. volunteer and paid staff;
- foundation and government grants, passenger donations; support from city and county, churches and businesses;
- 9. staff, board and others will develop budget; and
- 10. collaboration with transportation and human
- service agencies and faith communities.

SERVICE FEATURES:

- begin with weekday service, 9am-3pm, then expand to longer hours, then to weekend;
- 2. one way trip method;
- 3. destinations: medical, pharmacy, grocery, community centers, some social;
- eligibility: 16 and older, able to walk to the vehicle (including those with cane or walker);
- 5. 'door to door' service;
- 6. scheduling by phone/text;

- 7. training in-house by local, trained person or AACOG trainer;
- 8. risk management (driver training, insurance);
- 9. record-keeping of volunteer hours, destination and mileage, rider data, accounting and
- 10. technology to be used for scheduling and data software; website.

The initial *KerrKonnect* Board of Directors will comprise of an odd number of individuals (seven or nine). These <u>must include</u>:

- Chair a well-organized person who can move agendas forward, keep meetings on track and manage various points of view toward positive results;
- Treasurer a financial/numbers person familiar with QuickBooks, and preferably experienced with nonprofit accounting;
- 3. Medical community Liaison who can coordinate organizations with medical service recipients;
- 4. Public relations/marketing/development person with experience in effective communication; and
- 5. Business person who can temper emotionally driven goals with good business sense.
- Additional desired skill sets/experience include:
- 1. Attorney to provide legal guidance and advice;
- 2. A person significantly experienced with non-profit operation;
- 3. A person with city/county experience; and
- 4. A church care/social action person.

More than one of the desired skill sets may be satisfied with one person.

Greetings!

As we determine the vision of what we would like to see our congregation become and we create a mission statement that will hold us accountable in getting there, it is my belief that a covenant that is truly ours will become apparent.

This is something that every member of our congregation will be involved in. We are still working on how we will make this happen but be prepared because we are going to ask every member for input. Take some time to think about where you would like to see our congregation go, how we should go about getting there and how we should be treating each other along the way.
