 Speaker: Sandra Lane, Church Member - Topic: "History of the Labor Movement and UU's Support; History and present condition of the labor movement from a UU perspective with excerpts from talks and actions at various UU Churches". The talk will also address the contributions of UU songwriter and activist Malvina Reynolds and her family who were labor organizers with Lane singing a couple of Reynolds' songs.

Lane is a freelance writer and amateur musician who was a UU before moving to Kerrville in 2013. She was a coordinator for a UU Coffeehouse in Carrolton, TX, a member of the Dallas Folk Music Society and presented programs on the History of American Folk Music. Sandra earned a B.S. degree in Journalism from the University of North Texas, Denton.

8 Speaker: Carolyn Dreyer, church member - Topic: "U? U/UU? WHO YOU?" American Unitarians and Universalists merged in 1961, a marriage that was both damned and lauded - a not so surprising reaction since they represent two different, if not opposite, approaches to non-trinitarian, liberal religious practice. What were/are those differences? How have these opposites attracted to create a vibrant community of faith? Rev. Chris Buice of the Tennessee Valley UU Church compares Unitarians and Universalists to cats and dogs - and explains how they can live as peaceable together as our family pets do.

After a Protestant-church-hopping childhood, Drever discovered UUism in 1965 when she married into a wildly Unitarian family. She didn't become an official UU until 1968 when she joined the 700+member UU Church in Arlington, VA. She became an active volunteer in their social justice and outreach programs and continued that commitment in San Diego, CA and brought it to UUCHC when she moved to Kerrville in 2016. She began her "professional volunteer" career after 25 years in advertising/ marketing and is involved with KerrKonnect, HCCC, Habitat for Humanity, Freeman-Fritts Animal Shelter, League of Women Voters, TX Democratic Women, and the HC Archeological Association among others. She is the devoted servant of 'Felix' and 'Minnie', sibling rescue cats who are both Unitarian AND Universalists.

15 Speaker: Lee Legault, UU ministerial aspirant -Topic: "Stoic Spiritual Survival". Stoics were warriors of the mind who trained to build unbreakable will and character. Roman emperors and Vietnam POWs alike have dealt with challenges using Stoic techniques. What might we learn about surviving in this day and age from the ancient mindset of the Stoics? Are your habits helping you build your Inner Citadel, and do you even want one??

Legault is a UU ministerial aspirant working on a dual master's degree in social work at the University of Texas Austin and the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. She practiced law in the areas of civil litigation and appeals for fifteen years before answering her calling to be a different kind of counselor.

22 Speaker: Mindy Wendele, Executive Director, Families in Literacy - Topic: "Adult Literacy".

A native of Kerrville, Wendele has been involved in Kerr County leadership roles for many years. She studied at Schreiner College, Angelo State University, and is a graduate of the Economic Development Institute at the University of Oklahoma. Mindy has served on the Kerrville City Council, is a trustee for the Community Foundation of the TX Hill Country and the Peterson Health Foundation Board. She is a member of many other prominent civic organizations and has been a small business owner. Married to Chief Raymond Holloway, retired, she has one daughter, Meredith and a grandson, Foster.

29 Speaker: Rev. Mark Skrabacz (UU) - Sermon: "UU Emergence". Skrabacz will address the process of emergence, which can be comprised of three steps: 1. Letting go, 2. Accepting the present moment, and 3. Moving across the threshold into something new. Look at just one phase of this process briefly - letting go. Five billion years of evolution have ensured that although it's well and good just to "be here now," our primate and primal ancestors who did that got eaten. The ones who escaped, hunted, thrived and reproduced are the ones who were not satisfied with the present moment. They were the ones who developed keen senses of desire and aversion. We are the heirs of five billion years of that kind of paying attention. The survival of the fittest is the ability to adapt, which involves a lot of movement, processing and letting go. In this service, Mark will share how our UU Faith has grown as a result of processes of Emergence.

Summary of Wednesday, July 10, 2019 Board Meeting

Present: Board President Jerry Best; Vice President Vicki Luther; Treasurer Judy Bunch; Secretary Jill Wiggins; Member-at-Large Meredith Hensley; Activities & Events Chair Judy Ashcraft and Linda Smith.

Vicki Luther presided and read the covenant.

Board meeting minutes from the July 10, 2019 meeting were approved. Bunch presented the financial report which was also approved. She reported receipt of the insurance check for the repair of the parsonage roof.

Committee Chair Council report: Hensley requested a discussion of whether to hire someone for child care during Sunday services. After discussion, the board postponed a decision.

Activities & Events Committee report: Ashcraft reported that attendance at girls' night out and men's lunches were increasing. She also reported on upcoming events.

Social Justice Committee report: the committee has met and is looking into working with the Kerrville Public School Foundation. Chair Frances Osborne has asked for permission to send out "blast" emails regarding important social justice issues. The board requested further information, such as whether the issue was emerging and if it was necessary to reach members before the next Sunday service. The board supports the idea but agreed it needs to be part of a Social Justice Committee plan.

Finance Committee: Mike Burkett has informed Meredith that a preliminary budget will be ready for a board work session by November.

Membership: Steve Galland reported on the recent prospective member orientation.

New Business: Ashcraft reported that Frances Osborne has closed her food truck and offered to donate the inventory of various meat products to the church for a fundraiser. The board discussed options on how best to take advantage of the offer.

Linda Smith explained that because of term limits in the bylaws, board appointments and a shortage of personnel to fill positions we are in violation of the bylaws. She submitted proposed revisions, and a motion was approved to accept an option that will conform to current practice. A special congregational meeting was tentatively scheduled for after church on Sunday, September 15, to approve the bylaw revisions. Appointments: The board approved the appointment of Linda Smith to fill a vacancy on the Search Committee and Steve Galland as Membership Chair.

Vicki reported she has several designs for a memorial stained glass window that she will provide to the board. The board also agreed to move the banners depicting religious symbols to the wall behind the piano; move the wood sculptures in that space to the annex; and have a copy of the church's mission statement posted on the wall behind the podium.

Vicki also requested thoughts about whether to have a service Christmas Eve.


Making Lunch for the Crew Thursday, Sept 19 ★ 11:30am ★ Palmer Annex
