The Democratic Process

Unitarian Universalist (UU) congregations are different from other denominational congregations in the fact that we are autonomous congregations. This means that each and every UU congregation is allowed to run their congregation in a manner that suits the congregation rather than having the denomination determine how we should govern ourselves.

Every congregation is different. If you are traveling and visit another congregation on a Sunday morning you will see that every one of them has a different take on how they worship together. Here in Kerrville we have our congregation and also a UU Fellowship and we have different ways of worshiping and governing. You will find that if you visit other congregations this will be the case but in every case you will find that people adhere to the 5th principle which is "The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large".

In our congregation we have chosen to elect members to our Board of Directors as have many other congregations. Again, each congregation has determined

how this Board will reflect the values of the congregation. I have been a member of a Board that does nothing but write policy. This is accomplished by empowering the committees of the congregation to make decisions that are carefully worked out in a meeting where all of the committee chairs come together, and by listening to the members of the congregation they make determinations as to what the congregation is interested in. If a policy needs to be written, they make a recommendation to the Board.

I have also been a member of a Board that uses this same model but the Committees are represented in the Board meeting and together they work to accomplish the desires of the congregation. In my last congregation, which consisted of 15 members, the Board met once every six months and the Board President was given the duty of running the day to day operations of the congregation. During my time there we elected a Board and I spent months working with them to learn what a Board does and how to do it.

In our congregation our Board runs the day to day operations of the congregation. They listen to input from the committee chairs and they make decisions to keep the congregation running smoothly. Currently our Board does not write policies as they have farmed out the writing of policies to a committee to consist of several Board members, two congregation members and me. I believe this is a great idea which will allow congregational input so that all voices will be heard.

What is so good about policies? UU congregations are always very skeptical about policies. However, without them there is no direction and with every member attempting to move differently, it causes many complications. I believe some direction is necessary so that we can just look up the policy, know what we have decided on and know what direction to take. This will be especially helpful as our congregation continues to grow.

I hope you will take the time to think about what types of policies are important in your part of the congregation and if you are interested in being one of the two congregation members who will help write policies please contact any Board member or me.
