Background & Recap of "A Deeper Look" Gatherings Monday, July 11 & August 1 2-4pm - Palmer Annex

In order to continue the thinking and sharing that arose during the Start-Up session led by Natalie Briscoe in May, members and friends were invited to submit questions/comments/concerns at two Sunday services. Thereafter, a gathering of twelve church members held conversations in the Annex addressing submissions.

The two questions/comments that were received became the conversation starters for the first gathering.

July 11: Does the church really believe in our Mission Statement? Are we "living" the Mission Statement?

Our conversation addressed our knowledge of and the quality of our mission statement, as well as activities that supported our mission statement. We agreed there was room for improvement; however, this conversation was not to alter the statement, rather heighten our awareness and focus on our purpose. Although we reviewed the accomplishments that are in line with our mission, our conversation explored things we could do better.

Those actions included a review of IMPACT, the religious organizations we might partner with locally in support of IMPACT, and planning for group participation in the Legislative days sponsored by IMPACT. We also agreed we need to plan for our church's organized participation in the National Day of Service. We will also explore understanding our black community better in able to work with them in light of recent national events. Along with our support and leadership provided by Karen Burkett in the city-wide Transportation initiative, we felt these were areas we could best focus on in with the purpose intended in our mission statement.

Other possibilities explored included a Dark Skies Community Night at U-Bar-U, supporting Habitat for Humanity with lunches and ministerial blessings, expanding the Animal Blessing service to the neighborhood, and inviting friends to Sunday service or Adult RE events.

The second conversation starter discussed was:

When we ask our visitors to stay after church for
coffee so we can get to know them better, do we
actually do this? This conversation addressed the
feeling that our Sunday group seems to be in a hurry to
go to lunch and concerned about who is going to secure
the premises, resulting in those we invite to stay and
talk feeling ushered out. Since all attendees do not
go to lunch together, a decision was to try to serve
snacks after the service rather than before. Coffee
would still be available before and after services. By
acting with intention, it was felt that all attendees
would feel more welcomed and important.

All are invited to the Monday, August 1 gathering. Please place index cards with your questions and/or comments on the table at the back of the Sanctuary. New thoughts are welcomed, or come expand on what has already been discussed.
