Outreach/Social Justice Committee Backpack/Undie Sunday Update

Led by Ellen Jackson, the **Backpack/Undix Sunday** Program which is part of the UUCHC Outreach/Social Justice Committee supports La Casa de RAICES ((Refugee and Immigrant Center for Education and Legal Services) in San Antonio. Following is an overview and recap of the committee's major efforts.

In April, 39 complete backpacks donated by UUCHC were delivered to La Casa de RAICES. La Casa serves between 300 and 400 families per month and each family receives a backpack as they leave for their final destination somewhere in the U.S. The backpacks contain items to make traveling a little more comfortable. Please refer to this list at the end of the article.

These refugees are primarily young mothers and their small children who are escaping violence in their Central American countries. The numbers of refugees have surged recently due to the perceived threat of the "Trump Wall" at the Mexico/ United States border.

In September 2015, La Casa de RAICES launched its emergency shelter program for refugees who travel through San Antonio. San Antonio is unique because refugees from several detention centers across South Texas are released to the Greyhound station there prior to traveling to cities around the United States.

Refugees released from detention typically stay at La Casa between 12 to 48 hours. The work of the shelter is to make sure families have a warm meal, a place to decompress and collect supplies before heading out for 2-3 day bus or plane trip.

All of the work in sustaining the shelter is supported by volunteers. Typical volunteers work at the house for at least one 4-hour shift each week.

In May, Undie Sunday was added because La Casa reported a need for undergarments. Just like Backpack

Sunday, Undie Sunday surpassed expectations with over 100 undergarments supplied.

FROM YOUR MINISTER...

Greetings!

"What Does a Minister Do?"

During the Start Up Retreat held on May 14 this question was asked several times combined with a request for a time allocation for each named duty. I thought I would address these questions.

When a congregation begins its search for a Minister there is a Congregation Record which is suggested to be completed. Although our congregation did not utilize the form, below is the list of items which would have been assessed a number from 1 to 4, in terms of what the congregation was looking for.

Administration Community building Committee work Facilitation Music and liturgical arts Hospital calling Membership growth Preaching Social action Staff relations Youth work Adult religious education Children's religious education Denominational activities Stewardship Home visitation Leadership Personal counseling Scholarship Spiritual guidance Worship

These are the areas a Minister is taught to handle during the three years they are in seminary and when they are in a congregation being mentored by a seasoned Minister. Not all ministers do all of these things and most do more.

I was called by UUCHC as a half time Minister and as Natalie Briscoe, our UUA District Representative, emphasized during our Minister Start-Up Retreat, there is no such thing as a half time Minister.

I have found that Ministers do what is needed whenever it is needed and I agree with that 100%. Every one of the items listed above was either a seminary class or part of one and I have been trained in all areas.

The seminary I attended trained its students to become the CEO of their congregation according to guidelines put out by Peter Morales, President of the UUA. Ministers with larger congregations follow this model but our congregation does not and should not, as we are currently far too small. However, if we reach 300 members we might consider all these areas.

That being said, I handle all of these areas, plus I listen to you so that I can be your voice during Board meetings. I am your Minister and I am here for you during every phase of your life from blessing children, to marriage and to holding the hand of someone taking their final breath.


