### Transportation Study Group Grows & Evolves

The Transportation Study Group emerged from its summer cocoon to become The Transportation Planning Council. A successful community transportation forum was held at the Dietert Center on August 16 and the group received nearly fifty questionnaire responses describing specific needs, times and places. The next step is to distribute three different surveys throughout the community to three distinct populations: 1) employees, 2) potential riders, and 3) medical and social service providers. ALL transit rider surveys will be distributed in November and collected in early December.

### FROM YOUR MINISTER...

### **Greetings!**

You may have noticed that I have now become the Reverend Ja Rickard and may be wondering why my ordination was not held at UUCHC.

My ordination was held at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Mountain Home, Arkansas (UUFMH) which is my home congregation. This means that although I am your minister, my membership is held by the UUFMH. Many ministers choose to hold their ordination with their home congregation.

UUFMH is a tiny Fellowship. While I was part of that Fellowship, I met with the Ministerial Fellowship Committee (MFC) which is the committee of the Unitarian Universalist Association that determines whether a seminarian is ready to lead a congregation. I met with the MFC for the first time in October 2014 and as many UU Ministers experience, I did not pass their requirements at that time.

This 15-member group held me in their loving embrace for the next year while I prepared for my second attempt with the MFC. They encouraged me as I continued to study and helped me realize that I was indeed fit for ministry. We worked together to set up a working Board which the Fellowship never had and built the infrastructure that takes a Fellowship from a group of people to being a working congregation. By the time I returned to Boston to visit the MFC a year later we had both come a long way.

As I walked into the room for my meeting with the MFC I knew that 15 people were holding their breath and waiting for the results. I did pass and they were the first people I called with the good news. There were hugs and a party when I returned. The little Fellowship in Mt. Home will always have a special place in my heart and sharing this next part of my journey with them brought us both great joy.

I was very grateful to not have a traditional ordination as it was just our small group and exactly what I had hoped for. UUCHC sent beautiful flowers that left no doubt that you were there with me and it felt wonderful to know that I had both congregations holding me.

UUCHC has another special spot in my heart and I am grateful that I am your minister. We have much that we can accomplish together and now that I have had a vacation I am ready to get back to achieving our congregational goals together.
