# Background & Recap of "A Deeper Look" Gathering Monday, August 1

In order to continue the thinking and sharing that arose during the Start-Up Retreat led by Natalie Briscoe in May, members and friends were invited to submit questions/comments/concerns at two Sunday services. The recap of the second of the two gatherings held on August 1 was collated by Karen Burkett and is below. The recap of the first gathering held on Monday, July 11 may be found on the front page of the August "Our Church Life" newsletter.

What do you see as your role in the church's ministry both within and outside of the church? Ja clarified the fact that every person in this church is a minister and a representative of the church when dealing with the community.

Members shared approaches they've found successful in their "UU ministry in the community":

- Casual conversations with people in various community settings present frequent opportunities to mention activities or thoughts and ideas from "our church", which often lead to inquiries about our church and thus, opportunities to describe our UU faith.
- The small grey card that contains our Seven
   Principles and Six Sources can open discussion, or
   may be handed to someone who is interested.

The group agreed that being grounded in our UU faith is the best way to be a living example of UU values. We must each take on the responsibility to be a good member among members of the congregation; take an active role in the life of the church; and be willing to take a leadership role. Being true to oneself and one's faith includes being aware of the words we use, in talking with each other and with those in the community.

### What do you see as this church's role/ministry in Kerrville? What can/would you do to make it happen? How can our minister lead us into this church's ministry in Kerrville?

- The group felt that the church's role is to do the most good that we can within our community.
- The church is to be a sanctuary for issues of faith and for personal life choices.
- ① The church can:
  - ✓ grow in numbers so we can do more and so that we will have more legitimacy.
  - ✓ become a "Welcoming Congregation".
  - ✓ reach into the community and create more awareness by advertising/creating publicity in local newspapers, on our website, with the Chamber of Commerce, the Visitor's Guide to Kerrville, and other free and/or low cost forms.
