UUCHC Enjoys the Kerrville Holiday Lighted Parade in Style!



"Our Church Life" - More Material on Sunday Services in Chronological Date Order...

1 Speaker: Ann Galland, church member - Topic: "What the Heck is Chalica & What Does it Have to Do with our 7 Principles?".

Ann and husband Steve Galland are founding members of our UU congregation. Ann was raised Southern Baptist, growing up in both Texas and Oklahoma. Since retiring to this area in 1989, she discovered her passion for the performing arts. She has served the Point Theater (Hill Country Arts Foundation), Ingram, as actor, director, board member, and volunteer. She and Steve have a blended family of 6 children.

8 Speakers: Kathy Sears Hall, Big Sister and Caitlin Jones, Little Sister - Topic: "A Different Kind of Gift; how the Big Sister and Little Sister Program Has Enriched Our Lives."

Hall is a Kerrville native and graduate of Tivy High School. She holds an Accounting Degree from the University of Texas and spent 27 years in the energy industry. She now enjoys being back home and managing The Center for Fitness, a business her mother started over 40 years ago. Jones is a Senior at Tivy High School and is the Corp Commander for the Air Force Junior ROTC. She is an Athletic Trainer for Tivy Athletics and is active in her church. She hopes to go to Texas A&M University to major in biochemistry/chemistry.

15 Speaker: Don Pyle, church member - Topic: "Is There a Real Christmas Story?" - Now that Christmas is rapidly approaching, we find ourselves surrounded by the images of the nativity. Even non-Christians know the story itself: no room at the inn, the manger, the shepherds, the star. Have you ever wondered how it all got started....where it came from...does tradition represent what really happened? We will present a study of the available information to uncover what we really know, based on the book Born Divine, The Births of Jesus & Other Sons of God by Robert J Miller, a senior scholar with the Jesus Seminar.

In a previous life cycle, Pyle was an architectural and structural engineer specializing in the evaluation, repair, historic preservation and maintenance of structures of all types. He is definitely not a biblical scholar; however, he has devoted a lifetime to the avocational study of archaeology, history, religion, especially that of the near east. He has lectured and facilitated

discussion groups on related subjects, and is an Associate member of the Westar Institute, the sponsor of the Jesus Seminar.

22 Speaker: Frances Osborne, church member - Topic: "Celebrating the Winter Solstice."

Osborne was born in Austin, Texas and her parents are from Houston. She was raised Episcopalian and discovered Unitarian Universalism when she was searching for a liberal religious community in which to raise her son. When she knew she was moving to Kerrville, she searched the internet to find a UU church as she is "a devoted, practicing UU and cannot imagine life without Unitarian Universalism". Frances has interests in fellowship, hospitality, communications, website design, pastoral counseling and small group ministry. The life path she most identifies with is as a UU Pagan. She writes and leads rituals for all kinds of occasions.

29 Speaker: Michael Wurth, MA, NCC, LCDC, LPC
- Topic: "The Seven Principles and the
Eightfold Path" which will examine the
Buddhist concept of the Fourth Noble truth
with the UU exploration of wisdom and values.

Wurth was raised as a UU and spoke to his first UU congregation at the age of ten. He graduated from Indiana University with a Masters in Comparative Literature, became an Independent Film Screenwriter, Producer, Director, Editor winning critical praise and awards at multiple film festivals. He returned to graduate school to become a Licensed Professional Counselor and owns and operates the counseling service; Mainbrain, Inc. in San Antonio, is married to Shelagh Vale Wurth and has three children.

Summary of Wed., November 13, 2019 Board Meeting

Present: Board President Jerry Best; Vice President Vicki Luther; Secretary Jill Wiggins; Member-at-large Meredith Hensley; Judy Ashcraft, Activities and Events; and Mike Burkett, Finance Chair.

Board meeting minutes from the October 9, 2019, meeting were approved.

Jerry presented the Finance report, which was also approved after questions and discussion.

CCC report: The CCC did not meet on November 6, but will meet on November 20.

Nominating Committee: Judy Ashcraft reported there are people looking at job descriptions.

Membership: Steve Galland informed the board that two prospective members will attend orientation after the service November 17 and will be installed during the November 24 service.

Bryan Bristol & Janet Belden New members as of September 15


