- 5 Speaker: Mike Burkett, church member Topic: "Burning Bowl Service"; A UU tradition of burning away the negative in preparation for the **new year.** Burkett is a retired lawyer, a long time UU, has served as a UUCHC Board Officer, former Sunday Service Chair who cheerfully helps the current committee when a speaker cancels, and is the co-founder and current Board member of KerrKonnect.
- 12 Speaker: Stephanie Ertel Topic: "Don't Fence Me In". Kerrville native and well known environmental advocate, Ertel lives in an "off the grid" sustainable home near Mountain Home and has been active in many environmental organizations, locally, state and nationwide. She has run for state office twice and she and her husband Rick are retired attorneys.
- 19 Speaker: Rev. Betty Swarek Sermon: "Reality Based Religion". There was a time when practicing religion was a major part of the social fabric of our society. Religion still matters but its reputation has been tattered by the malpractice of its followers, the irrelevance of its message, and the glaring appeal of competing activities. How do we thrive in a world that no longer honors the rules and truths passed to us by our ancestors? When the old is no longer relevant and the new is intolerable; how do we bypass the baubles and distractions to find what really matters? Rev. Skwarck is a community minister affiliated with the Live Oak UU church in Cedar Park, TX. Her ministry, UU Free Range Ministry, reaches out to everyone who wants to explore religious ideas, organizations and practices from a liberal perspective and is not able to do that effectively in a traditional religious setting.

Present: Board President Jerry Best; Vice President Vicki Luther; Treasurer Judy Bunch; Secretary Jill Wiggins; Member-at-large Meredith Hensley; Past President Linda Smith; Mike Burkett, Finance Chair

Board meeting minutes from the November 13, 2019, meeting were approved.

Judy presented the Finance report. Following a discussion of bookkeeping costs, the report was also approved.

CCC report:

Meredith passed on a request (from Spiritual Development) that committee chairs be included in new member orientations, and that new members be invited to attend committee meetings. Meredith also reported on upcoming activities, including Christmas Eve, Free Speech Cafe on December 29, and the holiday party on January 4 (location TBA).

December donate-the-plate will go to the Hill Country Crisis Council; Vicki will look into assistance for Families & Literacy.

Linda reported for the Search Committee that one candidate had been considered. The committee determined that the candidate was not suitable because of unwillingness to relocate.
