## Appreciation, Welcome, Honesty in the Beloved Community

The energy in me two months into my contract is curiosity about UUCHC and gratitude for my getting to be here with you.

Two months into my contract, the energy in me is curiosity about UUCHC and gratitude for the opportunity to be here with you. When I first started (virtually) visiting, I was told that "the group" is generally appreciative of what gets shared on Sunday. So far, I witnessed as much, a generosity of spirit.

I've experienced a warm welcome as I transitioned from guest minister to your Minister. I've received some invitations and visits. I've received help getting out to community events. I've seen evidence of people being thoughtfully considerate of my needs. I've been given feedback that's been rich in appreciation.

I've wondered: "do guests and newcomers experience anything like what I have?" Granted a minister begins with a different relationship than a stranger. Still I bet that you give a warm welcome to others. That would be a sweet asset!

28 Rev. Phillip Schulman - Sermon: "UU solidarity with Native American Activism" - Native Americans are taking a lead in ecological organizing in "defense of the sacred," mother Earth; land, air and water. They are reclaiming native traditions, revitalizing culture and seeking to end centuries-long genocide attempts. How can we UUs be part of healing the racism that Natives face? How shall we side with love for justice, dignity and for life on Earth? What does solidarity look like?

UUCHC makes its mark by helping to clean the Hill Country



On Tuesday, October 5 an 8-person team from UUCHC started out bright and early to clean up a stretch of the River Trail from Louise Hays Park to the G Street Bridge. Armed with bright green 2021 UGRA T-shirts, trash picker-uppers, large dog food bags, gloves and wagons were used. First find was a fully-loaded dirty diaper followed by the usual beer cans, fast food containers, plastic bottles, etc. David was injured as he and Kevin struggled with a huge rusted metal cylinder. # November 18 Screening of "The Condor and The Eagle" ♦ Palmer Annex ♦ 6:30pm

SYNOPSIS: Indigenous environmental leaders embark on an extraordinary trans-continental adventure from the Boreal forest to deep into the heart of the Amazonian jungle to unite the peoples of North and South America and deepen the meaning of "Climate Justice". "The Condor & The Eagle" documentary offers a glimpse into a developing spiritual renaissance as the film four protagonists learn from each other's long legacy of resistance to colonialism and its extractive economy. Their path through the jungle takes them on an unexpectedly challenging and liberating journey, which will forever change their attachment to the Earth and one another.

At UUA General Assembly in 2018, our congregations passed a statement of immediate witness encouraging UUs to find way to stand in solidarity with Native American and other Indigenous People mobilizing resistance to development (i.e. transcontinental pipeline) that will have catastrophic effects re climate and ecology.
