- 3 Rev. Phillip Schulman Sermon: "The Legacy of Universalism". When UU becomes "Unitarians" for short, it's a reflection of what happened soon after the 1961 joining of two heretical Christian denominations. To many Universalists, the merger seemed to be more of a submerging of their faith. Fifty and now sixty years later, many UUs have turned back to reclaim the 2nd UU! What was this faith and how does it impact us today?
- 10 Speaker: Pamela Slutz, Former Ambassador to Mongolia - Topic: "There & Back Again".



Pamela Slutz was a career member of the United States Foreign Service who served as US Ambassador to Burundi and Mongolia. She also served at US embassies in Kinshasa, Zaire, Shanghai, China, the American Institute in Taiwan, and Nairobi, Kenya. Her Father was a Foreign Service Officer giving her the opportunity to live in many locations as a youth. She holds an MA in Asian Studies specializing in Indonesian studies from the University of Hawaii. Although retired, she continues to work part-time for the Office of the Inspector General, US Department of State. Ms. Slutz is married to Ronald J. Deutch, a fellow Foreign Service Officer. Since retiring she has also served as the chairman of the Board of Directors of the North America-Mongolian Business Council and was elected President of The Mongolian Society in 2019.



professional therapy. However, dream work can help us to understand the desires of our psyche for healing in our lives.

Henderson has been studying the practice of Dream Tending since 2005. In addition to studies at the Jung Center in Houston, through Pacifica Graduate Institute in Santa Barbara, she has completed a six-month clinical training program in 2008, a nine-month certification program in 2015, and two advanced certificate programs in 2019 and 2021. She is the founder of three dream circles: one in Houston which has been meeting since 1994 and two circles in Kerrville.

24 Speaker: Jill Wiggins, church member - Topic: "Poetry Lottery". If you've ever been bored listening to a poet standing stiffly reading one dry poem after another, with a little polite clapping in between, this won't be like that.
