- 5 Speaker: Mike Burkett, Church Member (Pat Kobe, Service Associate) - Service: "Burning Bowl Service" - A UU tradition of burning away the negative in preparation for the new year.
- 9 Rev. Phillip Schulman (Vicki Luther, Service Associate) - Sermon: "Taking It to the Streets" - Erosion of civil rights, one natural disaster after another, and an attack on democracy. What does it mean to be religious today? How do we "keep the faith" in these times?
- 16 Speaker: Karen Maddox (Mike Burkett, Service Associate) - Service: Doyle Community Center - Located at 110 West Barnett Street, the mission of the Doyle School Community Center is to provide a focus and location for the delivery of educational activities, community organizations, and services to children, adults, and senior citizens of Kerrville.
