Below is a wonderful photo Gregg Bellman of the San Antonio Astronomy Club took using the UBarU telescope recently.

Messier 81 (below) is a grand design spiral galaxy about 12 million light-years away, with a diameter of 90,000 light years, in the constellation Ursa Major. Due to its proximity to our galaxy, large size, and active galactic nucleus, Messier 81 has been studied extensively by professional astronomers.

PASTORAL REFLECTIONS...

Astronomy Infused Spirituality

President's Day weekend saw me part of the volunteer work crew at UBarU Camp and Retreat Center. In addition to a good workout, I enjoyed the company of UU women from various UU congregations there for a fiber artist retreat. And before you receive this newsletter; our congregation will have had its Midwinter Gathering there too. If you attended, I bet you have pleasant memories and stories to share.

One of the things I've appreciated most visiting UBarU in years past was the spiritual high gained laying on my back in my sleeping bag drinking in the night sky. The effect of seeing so many stars gave me waves of awe and peace.

Now UBarU has a powerful telescope, and a skilled instructor. With his laser light in hand, our very own Donnie Bunch leads UUs and friends on celestial tours. The facts he shares are guaranteed to take us into another realm. First stop was Orion's Belt. Next he pointed out Polaris, the North Star. Then came the "winter triangle." Any good tour guide shares exciting travel facts. Donnie tells the distance in light years from one end of the galaxy to the other. I'm looking a little more each time I get to go to another star party.

Facts and theories of the night sky are an example of how science can fuel and jazz up spirituality. Science findings can inspire us and feed our spiritual growth. On Sunday March 13th, I will ask us how to bring more science into our congregation's religious life.

"Science Infused Spirituality" will be a partner sermon to one I gave a few months back, "Life is Art." In it, I challenged us to increase the amount of artistic expression in our shared religious life. This time, let's brainstorm how to have more "moments of science" in our worship service. Using art and science, we will co-create spiritually rich experiences of liberal religion!


"Our Church Life" - More Material on Sunday Services in Chronological Date Order...

20 Speaker: David A. Schulman (Mike Burkett, Service Associate) - Service: "Lawyers and Criminal Law; Common Misconceptions and Misperceptions" - David Schulman will question our assumptions about lawyers and criminal law. He draws on 35 years of practice in criminal and appellate law, as a provider of Lawyer clinics, a published educator of appeals, and as Counsel to people set to be executed by the state of Texas. Our guest invites us to bring critical thinking and questioning and hopes to inspire a lively discussion.

David A. Schulman is Board Certified in both Criminal Law and Criminal Appellate law. He was a member of the Court of Criminal Appeals' central staff in 1991-1993 and has been lead counsel in hundreds of direct appeals and habeas corpus proceedings. Primarily a criminal defense lawyer, David also represents the State in certain criminal matters in the appellate courts. He practices law throughout Texas and maintains a law office in Austin.
