PASTORAL REFLECTIONS...

"You can't say that!" or "Maybe we can"

In one of my first visits to a UU service, I experienced liberation. Rev. Pontier articulated his reasons for rejecting the "doctrine of atonement," the idea that Jesus died for our sins. Today as Minister, I would say to anyone for whom this idea is important. "You are welcome here, and be prepared to have this idea respectfully questioned!" At 23, hearing my minister openly reject this doctrine took me into a new world. I had tried to make sense of the doctrine, and found no way. And there he was calmly articulation his rejection of this doctrine!

I had been raised Jewish despite having a Catholic mother. My father told me that we must respect others' religion. I thought it meant that I could never talk about the places where the two traditions were in conflict.

A UU congregation provided sanctuary for me to talk about things that I had been prohibited from expressing. Today I hold as sacred the creation of space where people get to talk about things that have previously been off limits.

I find it beautiful when we approach sensitive and difficult information with care and respect! I've looked back on several relationship breakups, and concluded that if we had only been able to talk it through, we could have stayed together or at least parted with love and understanding.

I imagine that each of us has things we find difficult to talk about, even things we believe we can't talk about. Trauma, loss and regret may fall in this category, and I'm not suggesting we abandon all protection of the tender things we carry. I imagine, however, that perhaps there are things we could remove from the "can't talk about it" folder and find we can share it in sacred space. UU congregations often encourage question of authority especially when our families or society has foisted unreasonable limits and prohibitions. For example we routinely challenge prohibitions based on sex, race, class and religion. Many souls have thrown off mental shackles with UU support. UU congregations often provide sanctuary, space for examining, reflecting, shifting and sometimes abandoning ideas that have held us back.

What is one way that this or other UU congregations have helped you question, reject or shift? When have you found space to discuss when there had been none? What have you placed in a folder marked "Can't talk about that!," or "Can't say that!?" that you might now reconsider? What are you ready to bring to the light of consciousness? What prohibitions have constrained your mind or spirit that you might be ready to challenge?

I pray that our congregation remains a place where people find fellowship, spiritual companionship, and permission to embody and fill spaces that were previously off limits to us!

17 Speaker: Speaker: Elena Westbrook (Bryan Bristol, Service Associate) - Topic: "Resurrect the World" - Long before Christianity, spring was celebrated as a time of rebirth. 
