#### PASTORAL REFLECTIONS...

#### **Treasure Quest**

UU doesn't conform to many people's idea of religion. We don't have a creed. We don't assert one book, or practice as the right way to live.

Religion offers a way to connect with something larger. Many traditions say that we are in relationship to a deity or creator. Traditions such as Buddhism speak of permanence and/or nirvana. UU congregations celebrate the diversity of ways to understand, express, approach or experience the sacred. We affirm the possibility of a direct experience of transcendent mystery, the reality of communion in nature. No belief in supernatural is required.

As a liberal religious tradition, we hold that rituals, beliefs, stories, sacred texts and spiritual practices are a means rather than an end. Religion provides maps. Words from scripture can offer a bridge to sacred ground. Ultimately, to find treasure, we must enter the territory and explore for ourselves.

Our tradition sends us on a treasure quest. It says that the treasure we seek might be too great for words, too big to be captured by our senses. Some call the treasure salvation, enlightenment, liberation... Some describe it as a peace that passes understanding. We recognize that these treasures have been spoken in every religious tradition.

In some sense each person must walk her own walk. We recommend bringing, finding, acquiring or building your own compass! If you don't have one, we gladly offer guidance and companionship for the journey. In time you'll discover your own.

And yet in a very real sense we journey together! We keep finding ways forward together. The journey continues, and we find treasure all along the way. Did I mention that we find treasure in each other? ... We are very glad for your company, and we give thanks for our journey together!


