#### FROM YOUR MINISTER...

#### Our Religious Religion and Politics

You might be reading this after the election. You might be celebrating or mourning. Right now, I feel and imagine a lot of tension in the air.

We know that elections will impact our nation's future. Our nonprofit status leads us to remain nonpartisan as a congregation.

We do not endorse one political party or candidate. However, we do advocate for issues. For example, there is extreme UU support for reproductive rights, including access to safe legal abortion. So, the cheer has gone out "Roe, Roe, Roe the Vote!"

UUs engage in the political sphere through TXUUJM, UUtheVote, Side with Love, UU Ministry for Earth and other organizations. Our UU tradition encourages us to roll up our sleeves and get involved in the work to

remove the barriers to justice and planetary well-being. Preeminent Unitarian theologian James Luther Adams called agency one of the 5 smooth stones of religious liberalism. He wrote: "We deny the immaculate conception of virtue and affirm the necessity of social incarnation. Good things don't just happen. People make them happen."

We UUs will continue to engage in politics. To do otherwise would be to turn away from social responsibility. Political decisions can lead us closer to the Beloved Community or further into oppression. Our congregations covenant with each other to promote democracy (one of 7 purposes). Whether midterm elections give us cause for celebration or mourning, we will continue in the struggle to achieve justice and social wellbeing!

Tradition gives us a vision of beloved community. Whatever else we might imagine the beloved community (or heaven) will be like, I'm imagining everybody experiencing being known and appreciated. Who isn't positively impacted by understanding, care, consideration and appreciation?! So I'm looking to learn from you. Has your experience been at all like mine? If yes, how did the congregation get this way? What helps sustain warmth and generosity of spirit?

Most of us have also experienced times when communication gets difficult. I will be here to receive feedback and concerns when experiences are not pleasant! Our faith encourages us to grow in our

abilities to share difficult feedback with kindness and respect. This too is part of creating beloved community.

For now, I'm just basking in the kindness I've found. I'm eager to learn more about how it got here and how we will nourish and sustain it so that those who come in 2022 and beyond will find it too.
