4 Speakers: UUCHC Members, Janet Belden & Vicki Luther (Belden & Luther, Service Associates; Sherri Curry, Chalice Table) - Talk: "Catholic Upbringing, UU Faith".

Janet joined UUCHC September 2019. She and her husband Bryan moved to Kerrville from the Dallas area where they attended Community UU Church. She retired in 2020 from a 38-year career in financial software.

Vicki happily serves on our UUCHC board. Currently, she shares a dwelling with two Corgis and one cat and her horse, Steve, lives at a friend's barn. Vicki rides 5 times a week (in a perfect week) and Steve's job is teaching her how to keep her balance.

- 11 UUCHC Reverend Phillip Schulman (Sarah Johanson, Service Associate; Judy Ashcraft, Chalice Table) Sermon: "Ordination Harvest". Congregation and Minister will reflect and amplify takeaways, inspiration, challenges, and education, as well as personal and congregational gains.
- 18 Speaker: Steve Brooks (Janet Belden, Service Associate; Kevin Hartley, Chalice Table) Talk:
 "True West: A Multicultural Mythology". In books, movies and songs, the archetypes of the cowboy and the frontier have shaped American values like rugged individualism. In recent years, though, historians have revealed a more inclusive West, not centered on heroic white men. Austin UU speaker and singer Steve Brooks explores how a multicultural West might rewrite our values and give us a richer picture of the cowboy.

Steve is a writer and performer whose creativity points in many directions. His songs have been recorded by more than a dozen folk and Americana artists like Slaid Cleaves, Russell Crowe and Albert & Gage. His two most recent CDs, "I'll Take You Home" and "Chasing Grace," have been played on more than 100 folk and Americana stations coast-to-coast. In an earlier incarnation on radio, he was a humorist who wrote a song-aweek for Jim Hightower's nationally-syndicated talk show.

When he's not onstage, you can find him in a pulpit, speaking on topics like "Songwriting as a Spiritual Path." Or in a library, introducing kids to classic American folk songs. Or flexing his wits as six-time World Pun Champion. If that's not enough, he's been an award-winning journalist

- for over 25 years. Kick off your shoes and poke around a bit. You'll find plenty to keep you entertained and inspired, and you'll find out why "Stave Magazine" calls Steve "simply the cleverest man you'll hear with a guitar."

Reminder! Covid Act Now Alerts <www.covidactnow.org>

Covid Act Now provides a 3-color Covid com-munity risk level score for every state, county, and metro in the U.S. The scoring is informed by 3 key metrics: weekly, new reported COVID cases, weekly COVID hospital admissions and the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID patients. The UUCHC Board uses these alerts to determine whether our church needs to change its mask wearing/singing stance.

The framework is based on the CDC's Community Level framework.

For those who sign up to receive alerts, they are only emailed on Tuesday and Friday, and only to locations where the community risk level has changed. For the most up-to-date community risk level assessments, check out the real-time metrics on the site.

Small UUCHC teams have always participated in the River Clean Up but, this year, nearly half of the congregation's members and friends have registered for the On Your Own Clean Up in October. Yay!



ACTING FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE with TXUUJM

Below are minutes taken by Carolyn Dreyer, Outreach/Social Justice Committee Co-Chair who "attended" the Zoom call on Thursday, August 11.

"If you, like many UUs, are looking for individual ways to effectively battle racism, poverty and environmental destruction...If you want to fight FOR health care, truthful public education, voting and reproductive rights and equality, look no further than the TXUUJM's Action Hour ZOOMED every Thursday at 7pm.

UUCHC has long been a member of the Texas UU Justice Ministry but our participation has been limited. Now, dynamic young minister Rev. Erin Walters is spurring us to action. I "attended" the first post-summer break Action Hour on August 11. It actually began at 6:30pm with a We Cry Justice half hour of "spiritual reflection" led by Jim Crosby of the Poor People's Campaign. This included prayer, a Bible reading (Luke 4: 18-21) and Martin Luther King's stirring declaration to "dedicate his life to those left out of the sunshine of opportunity." The concept of "othering" was discussed: the often-too-easy putting aside of those unlike us.

In the chat, someone remarked that Jesus was the ultimate revolutionary, yet we liberals who are actually practicing his teaching are defiled as evil RADICALS. Interestingly, another newer "evil" was listed during this time: the "distorted moral narrative of Christian nationalism."

At 7pm, Rev. Walters lit the UU Chalice and the Action Hour began. TXUUJM has allied itself with a number of state and national NON-PARTISAN, ISSUE-ORIENTED organizations such as Planned Parenthood, Teach the Truth, the Sanctuary Movement and the League of Women Voters.

Each week, working with these groups, the Action Hour features concrete, real-time, hands on ACTIONS to take. For example, Action Step One on Aug 11 was working with Teach the Truth to prepare and submit either online/phone/in-person testimonials supporting

public education to the State Board of Education which meets Aug 30-9/2 in Austin.

Action Step 2: A Side with Love rep offered links to a "Skill Up": how to set up/host a phone or text bank.

Action Step 3: How to contact Congress to support the leaders of the Sanctuary Movement who have been heavily fined and threatened with deportation.

All recommendations, links, and contacts, are offered during the Hour and participants are urged to share with their congregations and likeminded friends. Rev. Walters reminded us the recent victory for reproductive rights in Kansas was the result of three long years of door-to-door canvassing; community engagement; phone banks; personal conversations working with Planned Parenthood's "Bans Off Our Bodies". This kind of boots-on-the-ground effort, like the ones for Civil Rights and Women's Suffrage, is what's needed to make the massive changes needed today.

But we ALL have to ACT NOW. So ZOOM in THURSDAYS at 7pm (or 6:30) to the TXUUJM ACTION HOUR. Get the link on Facebook or txuujm.org. (DAVID GROSS, the official UUCHC TXUUJM rep is on hiatus in Maine. He'll return mid-Sept and will be our TXUUJM contact.)"
